

Plant	Friend - OK to Grow Together	Foe- Do Not Grow these plants together	Notes
1. Corn 2. Beans 3. Squash or Pumpkin Grow these 3 together	Beans- Eggplant Corn - Cucumbers Squash - Nasturtiums	Beans- do not grow with alliums (onions, garlic, leeks) Corn - Tomatoes Squash - Potatoes	This combination is called the 3 sisters. The corn is a natural support for beans. Corn uses a lot of nitrogen. Beans are a nitrogen fixer. The squash have large leaves to block weeds.
Tomatoes	Basil, Marigolds, Asparagus	Corn	Basil repels flies and mosquitoes. Marigolds help to keep away tomato hornworms. Corn and Tomatoes are susceptible to a common fungus.
Potatoes	Corn, Bean, Peas	Tomatoes, peppers	You will note that Potatoes, Tomatoes and Peppers are all members of the nightshade family, and, therefore, all susceptible to the same diseases.
Cucumbers	Bush beans, lettuce, radishes, cantaloupe	Potatoes	You may get potato blight if you plant cucumbers with potatoes
Peppers	Carrots, Eggplant, Onions, Parsley and Tomatoes, Basil	Kohlrabi	Basil will keep thrips, flies and mosquitoes at bay. These can be detrimental to pepper plants
Lettuce	Carrots	Cabbage	Lettuce has shallow roots, carrot roots will be deeper in the soil
Onions	Broccoli Kale Brussels sprouts Cabbage	Beans, Peas	Onions will naturally repel the pests of the cabbage family, such as cabbage worms.
Beets	Bush Beans, Cabbage, Broccoli, Kale, Lettuce, Onion, Garlic	Pole Beans	Pole beans and beets stunt each other's growth
Herbs such as chives, oregano, thyme, garlic,	Rosemary - sage	Do not plant Rosemary near any herbs other	Plant around other plants in your garden to

rosemary		than sage.	minimize harmful insects.
Peas	Radish, Turnip, carrots	Garlic and Onions, beans	Peas and beans are not chemically compatible. Planting these together may also lead to an off taste.
